

Barton Deakin Brief –ACT Shadow Ministry

Overview

Following the election of Mark Parton as leader of the Canberra Liberals, a reshuffled shadow cabinet has been announced. The changes aim to present a "refreshed and forward-looking" opposition, uniting the party and strategically positioning it for the 2028 election.

Key changes to the shadow ministry include the return of Elizabeth Lee and Peter Cain, who were previously suspended from the party room, alongside significant portfolio realignments.

Key Promotions and Changes to Shadow Cabinet:

- **Deborah Morris** promoted to Deputy Opposition Leader.
- Elizabeth Lee returns to the Shadow Cabinet, taking on Education, Environment and Climate Change, and Tourism and Events.
- Peter Cain returns to the Shadow Cabinet, overseeing Community Services,
 Government Services, Veterans, and Seniors.

Strategic Analysis

- Mark Parton (Leader) Health, Transport, Gaming, and Aboriginal & Torres
 Strait Islander Affairs: By taking on prominent portfolios like Health and
 Transport, Parton is positioning himself at the forefront of critical service
 delivery debates. These are often high-stakes portfolios with significant public
 interest and opportunities to highlight government shortcomings. His personal
 involvement underscores these as priority areas for the opposition.
- Deborah Morris (Deputy Leader) Planning, Police, Emergency Services, Home
 Ownership & Housing Affordability, and Corrections: Morris's expansive
 portfolio, particularly her oversight of Home Ownership and Housing
 Affordability (now reunited), signifies a strong focus on cost-of-living issues
 and addressing the ACT's housing challenges. This strategic alignment targets



a broad demographic, including first-time homebuyers and those struggling with housing costs, and positions the party as a champion for accessible housing solutions.

- Return of Elizabeth Lee and Peter Cain: Their reintegration into the shadow cabinet, despite previous suspensions, is a pivotal move for party unity. Lee's assignment to Education, Environment and Climate Change, and Tourism and Events positions a seasoned politician in areas that resonate strongly with a diverse voter base, particularly younger generations and environmentally conscious voters. Cain's portfolios in Community Services and Government Services allow him to continue contributing to oversight of key government functions.
- Portfolio Refinements Environment and Climate Change: The shift from
 "planning and environment" to "environment and climate change" for Lee's
 portfolio highlights a specific and contemporary focus, potentially allowing the
 Liberals to differentiate their environmental policies and appeal to a broader
 cross-section of the electorate, challenging perceptions in this space.
- Ed Cocks (Treasury): Retaining a key economic portfolio underscores a consistent focus on fiscal responsibility and economic management, a traditional strength for the Liberal Party.
